How to inform PCS of Your Child's Absence

Please let the Attendance Office know by 8.30am on every day that your child is off school. If your child has been issued with a Doctor's Note detailing the agreed length of absence, you can forward this to the Attendance Office instead of calling each day.

There is an answer phone for out-of-hours messages. You will need to leave the name of the student, their year group and the reason for absence.

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Punctuality Matters

Good punctuality to both lesson and to school leads to higher levels of achievement.

When students arrive late at school, they miss out on essential teaching and learning at the beginning of the school day.

This can reduce achievement. regardless of a student's academic ability.

Your child may also feel awkward arriving to the classroom where everyone is settled and students arriving late can disrupt the entire class.

Registration starts at 8.40am and all students are expected to be in their 1st lesson at this time. Students arriving after this time will be marked as late.

Students who arrive after the registers have closed will be marked with an unauthorised absence mark for the morning session in line with Government guidelines.

Every Minute Counts

LATENESS = LOST LEARNING (FIGURES BELOW ARE CALCUALTED OVER A SCHOOL YEAR)

5 minutes late each day - 3 days lost!

10 minutes late each day

- 6.5 days lost! 15 minutes late each day

- 10 days lost!

20 minutes late each day

- 13 days lost!

25 minutes late each day

- 19 days lost!

Attendance Rewards | Enrichment

Reward incentives for excellent attendance are available throughout the school year, with a variety of initiatives. At our school, we believe that good attendance is the collective responsibility of all members of our community.

We encourage all students to monitor their attendance and take ownership of their attendance record, as well as support their peers to do the same. We encourage parents/carers to contact us and share any concerns or barriers that are preventing their child from having regular school attendance.

We also recognise that for some students it is not always possible to achieve 100% attendance and we take this into account when considering who qualifies for the rewards we offer.
